Uppsala 27/12-30/12

Uppsala is the fourth largest city in Sweden with 195 000 citizens. Uppsala is located 70 kilometers north of Stockholm and is the main city in the province of Uppland.

Two of the most famous buildings in Uppsala are the cathedral and the castle.





The cathedral from 1435 is built in the Gothic style and is one of the largest in northern Europe, with towers reaching 118.7 meters.

In Uppsala there are two Universities, Uppsala University and the Swedish University of Agricultural sciences. Uppsala University is the oldest university in Sweden and was founded in the 1477.

There are 40 000 students in Uppsala and the student life in Uppsala is unique. There it's a lot of activities for the students and the main activities take place at the 13 student social clubs called nations. At the nations the students can study, have lunch, dance, act, party, play music, listen to concerts or just socialize.

The second University in Uppsala is the *Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences*. The head office is located in Ultuna, just outside Uppsala, but the University has several campuses in different parts of Sweden. The student Union at Ultuna is the home of IAAS Sweden and all the IAAS members are students at the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences.

Gimo 30/12-3/1

Gimo is a small village in the municipality Östhammar, 50km north of Uppsala. The population of Gimo is 2.700 people and it has an old history as an iron industry center. Here are we going to stay at a hostel the second part of the week.

Visa information

Not everyone needs visa to enter Shengen zone. Check on this site whether you need it or not:

If you need one, you can apply for a Shengen visum/ Visum C in a Swedish embassy or consulate. Important is that you apply for a visa in the country that serves as your point of entry to the EU (depending on your choice of arrival airport). Requirements for obtaining a visa

If you wish to visit Sweden and the other Schengen countries, you must have

- a passport which is valid for at least three months after the final date of the visa.
- money for your keep and for the journey home. Sweden requires that you have SEK 450 for each day spent in Sweden. In certain circumstances, this amount may be lower, for example in the case of a young child, if the cost of food and accommodation is paid in advance or if you are going to stay with relatives or friends. You must be able to demonstrate that you have sufficient funds for your keep with the help, for example, of bank statements or a document in which the person inviting you to Sweden promises to meet all expenses during the visit.
- individual medical travel insurance which covers the costs which could arise as a result of emergency medical assistance, emergency hospitalization or medical repatriation. The insurance should cover costs of at least EUR 30,000 and be valid in all the Schengen countries.

When you have a confirmation about your obtained visa, you can get your visa at the embassy/consulate. When getting it, you will need a proof of transport to and back from Sweden which mentions your name and is not changeable! (So your flight ticket probably).

Please keep in mind that the application procedures can take up to two to three months, so make sure you apply early enough.
